

**Information by the NUPS Epidemiological Operational Corps Educational  
Subcommittee (EOCES)  
to all Students and Staff**

Temporary arrangements for the modified teaching and learning order are set by the Rector's Circular on The Arrangements on Distance Learning issued on the 18th of March 2020 and information provided by the NUPS EOCS. These guidelines ensure that students are provided all conditions to successfully complete the academic year and for those completing their degree to obtain their diploma. It is important to emphasise that teachers set study requirements with enhanced diligence in respect to the extraordinary circumstances and ensuring the rules of fair treatment.

Further detailed rules of the distance learning arrangements will be determined by the amendment of the Academic and Examination Regulations (hereinafter: AER) to be issued on the 15<sup>th</sup> of April 2020.

Based on the amendment of the AER, the deans will issue implementing provisions for all Faculties by the 15<sup>th</sup> of April 2020.

By the 30<sup>th</sup> of March 2020 the Faculties inform the students on the deadline for the submission of thesis / diploma papers for a deferred date, which may not be earlier than April 30, 2020.

According to the developments of the epidemic emergence, the latest by 15 May 2020 the University decides whether final examinations will be conducted according the current curriculum arrangements or distance learning arrangements. The decision will provide enough time for the preparation of the students.

In the case of doctoral schools temporary rules on distance learning apply. Nevertheless, complex examinations and other events requiring in person participation (e.g. debates, doctoral thesis defense and habilitation procedures) keep being postponed to an undefined date (relevant deadlines will be extended accordingly).

For the teaching staff it is important to note that the administration of teaching activities in the Neptun system and relevant teaching obligations will fall under new regulations for the entire time of distance learning.

The general rule applying to foreign students reads as follows: in case the foreign student registered for a given course-unit in the spring semester of 2019/2020 and actively enrolled in it, the student is entitled to the relevant ECTS credits and best grade without any further preconditions. For those foreign students that are capable to actively follow a distance course the teacher must provide the possibility for this, has to respond to the student's request via email and provide the student with study material and assignments (without any obligatory assessment).

On the altered conditions related to the activities of the scientific student association the Faculties will inform both students and teachers.
